# Millau Viaduct: the tallest bridge in the world! 



The Millau viaduct is a road bridge that crosses the valley of the River Tarn in Southern France. At its tallest point it is 343 m tall, which makes it 19m taller than the Eiffel Tower and 37m shorter than the Empire State Building. Interestingly, the Millau viaduct was built more than one hundred years later than the Eiffel Tower, however they were both built by the same company, the Eiffage Group.
Work began in October 2001 and the bridge was officially opened by the French President, Jacques Chirac, on 14th December 2004. Two days later, it was opened for traffic. The bridge is just under two and a half kilometres long and every day between 10,000 and 25,000 cars cross the bridge.

The architects who were working on the bridge didn't want drivers to feel scared at this height. So, they designed the bridge in a way that when driving, it's difficult to look down.
