Section 2: Reading

Some infections are caused by viruses and some by bacteria. Viruses are very small germs that can enter our cells. When a virus reaches our cells, it ¹ divides quickly and then we become ill.

A very infectious viral disease is the common cold. There are about 200 viruses that cause it and this is the main reason a cure for the common cold has not been found.

Another viral disease is influenza (the flu). Influenza viruses spread around the world every year causing illness to millions of people. Unlike the common cold, the flu virus can spread to the lungs and may cause a serious infection like pneumonia ² which can be deadly.

When we get a virus ³, our immune system works to stop it ⁴. When the virus is destroyed, the immune system can remember that virus and prevent us from being infected again - this is how we develop immunity.

We often have vaccinations ⁵ when we are children to protect us against serious diseases such as measles and polio. The vaccine injects a weak or dead virus into our body which the immune system destroys and remembers. A cold or flu virus, however, can make very small changes to itself so that our immune system does not recognize it. This is why we keep catching colds.
