case	a question for court of law to decide	caso, causa, pleito
cell	a small room in a prison or police station	celda

charity shop	people give old clothes, books, etc. to charity shops	tienda de artículos de segunda mano con fines benéficos
check	to look to see if something is all right	revisar, comprobar
cheque	a special piece of paper which tells a bank to pay	cheque

nasty	not nice, kind or good	repugnante, antipático, desagradable
news	the story of things which happened yesterday or which are happening now	noticias
newspaper	sheets of paper with news, which you can buy every day or every week	periódico
pay	to give money for	pagar
policeman	somebody whose job is to stop people breaking the law, and to catch people who steal, murder, break into houses, etc.	policía
police station	the office where policemen work	comisaría de policía
prison	a building for criminals, where the doors are locked	prisión
prove	to show that something is right or true	demostrar
reporter	someone who works for a newspaper, radio or television and tells about things which have happened	periodista, reportero
send (past tense sent)	to make something or someone go somewhere	enviar
snatch	to take something in a very quick, violent way	arrebatar
steal (past tense stole)	to take something which is not yours	robar
trouble	difficult or worrying times; problems	problema, dificultad
truth	what is true	la verdad
unhappy	not happy	infeliz, triste
win (v)	to be the first, or the best, in a game, race, lottery, etc.	ganar
winner	a person who wins	ganador
