## Grammar Spot - Countable and Uncountable Nouns

## Nouns can be divided into countable and uncountable nouns

## Countable Nouns:

We can count these nouns because they have a singular and plural form:
Amina said: 5 bananas, we can say: 1 banana (singular form), 2 bananas, 100 bananas etc. (plural form)
We can use a singular verb or a plural verb: A banana is yellow. Bananas are yellow.

## Uncountable Nouns:

We can't count these nouns because they only have one form: we CAN'T say 1 rice -2 rices. We can't use a or an for uncountable nouns. A rice ( $x$ )

Amina said: some rice, some pineapple juice etc.
We can only use a singular verb: Rice is delicious. Pineapple juice is very sweet.

Some categories of uncountable nouns
Liquids \& Gases: milk, water, oil, coffee, rain, soup, air, smoke, juice etc.
Abstract Ideas (Things we can't touch): taste, love, help, weight etc.
Made of smaller parts: salt, rice, flour, sand etc.
Some food: fish, bread, pasta, etc.

## Grammar Spot - Some and Any

## Some:

We use 'some' in positive sentences with uncountable nouns and plural nouns.
Examples: There is some milk in the fridge (uncountable noun)
There are some oranges in the fruit bowl (countable plural noun)
We can also use 'some' in questions when ask for things or offer things.
Examples: Can I have some rice, please? (uncountable noun)
Would you like some apples? (countable plural noun)

## Any:

We use 'any' in questions and negative sentences with uncountable nouns and plural nouns.

## Examples:

Is there any milk in the fridge?
Are there any bananas in the fruit bowl?
I don't have any sugar in my tea.
She doesn't have any tomatoes.

## Grammar Spot - Would like

## Would like:

We use 'would like' as a polite way to request something or make an offer:

## Example:

I would like a large pizza, please. (This is a polite way of saying 'I want a large pizza')

Would you like some pizza? Answer: Yes, please or No, thank you
We can also use 'd as the short form of would.
He would like an ice-cream = He'd like an ice-cream.

## Grammar Spot: Many / Much / a lot of

## Many:

We use many with countable nouns in questions and negatives.

## Examples:

How many apples are in the fridge? (countable noun - apple) This is a question with a countable noun

There aren't many apples in the fridge? This is a negative sentence. It means that there are only a few apples in the fridge.

## Much:

We use much with uncountable nouns in questions and negatives.

## Examples:

How much salt is in the food? (uncountable noun - salt) This is a question with an uncountable noun

There isn't much salt in the food? This is a negative sentence.

## A lot of:

We use $\boldsymbol{a}$ lot with both countable and uncountable nouns in positive sentences.

## Examples:

There are a lot of apples in the fridge. This is a positive sentence with a countable noun. Don't forget that countable nouns use the plural verb *are*

There's a lot of salt in the food. This is a positive sentence with an uncountable noun. Don't forget that countable nouns use the singular verb *is*
