Title: Pharmaceutical Care I	
Course number: 541 PHCL	
Semester: Ninth Semester (Fifth year).	
Duration: 2 + 0 Units (2 contact hours) per week.	
Aims: To provide general knowledge on pharmaceutical care, health care, medical orders, interviewing and monitoring of patients and modification of plans of patient care.	
Objectives: Upon successful completion of the course the student should be able to understand the principles of pharmaceutical care, health care, monitoring and modification of plans of patient care.	
Contents: This course introduces students to philosophy of practice, professionalism, entrepreneurship, patient adherence, patient counseling, patient-oriented pharmaceutical care and education, patient interview, review of medical records, compliance, patient drug therapy assessment skills and prescriptions. Monitoring and modifying plans of patient care are studied with the goal of assuring positive outcomes.	
Minimum course requirements: 30 (2 x 15) Unit lectures (30 contact hours) per level.
