Little  hops three hops. Can you?



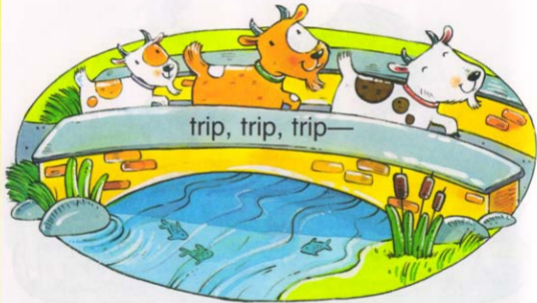
She finds one little billy goat, and . . .

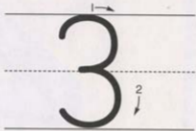
