"d" to the end of the word:

Danny likes to walk to school.

Yesterday Danny walked to school.

Danny has walked to school every day this week.

My baby can smile.

She smiled yesterday.

My baby has smile<u>d</u> a lot this week.

For some verbs, you don't add "d" or "ed", but another ending to talk about the past. Some verbs change completely:

Robert likes to eat pasta.

Yesterday he ate pasta.

He has <u>eaten</u> pasta every day this week.

In this dictionary, you can see these changes in brackets () after the word:

eat (ate eaten)

Comparing words

"Describing" words, such as "small", "expensive" and "good" are called adjectives. When you use an adjective to compare things, you usually just add "er" or "est" to the end of the word:

A horse is smaller than an elephant, but a mouse is the smallest.

For some adjectives, instead of adding "er" or "est", you say "more" or "most" before the word:

A car is <u>more</u> expensive than a bicycle.

A truck is the <u>most</u> expensive.

You must be more careful.

Sara is the most careful.

For a very few adjectives, you don't add "er" or "est", or "more" or "most", but change the whole word:

This cake is good.

This cake is better.

This cake is the best.

In this dictionary, you can see these unusual words in brackets () after the word:

good (better best)

More than one

"Naming" words, such as "goat", "sheep", "mouse" and "child" are called nouns.
When you use a noun to talk about more than one thing, you usually add an "s" to the end of the word:

one goat two goats

one house two houses

If the word already ends with an "s", you add "es" to the end instead:

one cross two crosses

For a very few nouns, you don't add an "s" or "es" to the end, but keep the word exactly the same:

one sheep two sheep

For a few nouns you add a completely different ending:

one child two children

For some nouns, you don't change the ending, but you change the whole word:

one mouse two mice

one goose two geese
