George: We are going to stay there for 10 days.


Idris: Are you going to stay in a hotel?

We use both 'going to' and 'will' to talk about the future. Look at the examples below:

Past Simple	Present Simple	Future Simple
I played football	I play football	I <u>will</u> play football I am <u>going to</u> play football

There are some differences between 'going to' and 'will'. Look at the diagram below for when to use 'going to' vs 'will'.

Going to	Will

They are going to Riyadh for the wedding.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Evidence <p>Ali is very sad. He is going to cry. We missed the bus. We are going to be late.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Rapid Decisions <p>It's hot, I will open the window. I'm thirsty, I will buy a drink.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Promise <p>Don't worry, I will help you. I'll go to the store for you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Offer <p>I will lend you my book. I will give you some help.</p>


You can use both for making predictions: Look at the example below.



We can use 'let's' to make a **suggestion** for everyone. **Let's = Let us**

Example: Let's go visit Aisha.

Let's get a taxi to the hospital.

Let's is the same as I suggest.

We can also ask and make **suggestions** using 'shall'

Example: Shall we go to the museum?

Shall we buy her a small gift? – This is the same as saying – I suggest that we buy her a small gift

Hello ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls – welcome to our weekly ‘Future Tech’ show; here, we discuss the latest technology devices coming your way soon. Today, we’re going to talk about **flying cars**, **special glasses** and new-generation **phones**.



Flying cars; this invention is special because we won’t need planes anymore. You can fly around the world in the comfort of your own car for a cheaper price than a flight ticket. This car is being developed by BMW. The drawbacks include higher fuel costs and more pollution. We can expect the first car to be ready in 2021.

New-generation phones: This invention should be in your local phone shop in 2020. You won’t need a charger if you live in a hot country. Your phone will automatically recharge while it’s in your pocket. It uses solar energy from the sun so you won’t need to use electricity and pay for it. The bad points are that these phones don’t work in winter or cold places. Samsung recently said that they will only sell their phones in places like the Middle-East, north Africa and Australia.



Special glasses: These glasses are being developed by Rayban. They should be ready and fully functional in 2024. They are special because they have the ability to display subtitles of what the person is hearing. They can also translate the words being heard into your own language so they are great if you are in a foreign country. The cons are that these glasses are very pricey. You can expect one pair to cost around 15 thousand Saudi riyals.
