But then, with some time and perhaps help from locals, people will start the adjustment stage and begin to feel more familiar and comfortable with the new environment. Adaption and acceptance is the final stage which contributes to the successful integration. In fact, there is no magic solution for dealing with culture shock. Everyone has to find his or her own balance between the values of home country and those of the host country.

Birth to a Syrian mother doesn't automatically confer nationality . If a Syrian woman marries a foreign husband , their children will have the foreign husband's nationality and have no claim to Syrian nationality , even if they were born and raised in Syria . The legal ramifications are that these persons face a number of obstacles , one of which is their inability to work in the public sector . The other way to obtain Syrian nationality is through naturalization . Non-nationals who have resided in the country for over 5 years and fulfilled a number of requirements can apply for naturalization . A foreign woman who marries a Syrian man can naturalize on the basis of that marriage , but a foreign husband cannot acquire Syrian citizenship on the basis of marriage to a Syrian wife .

As long as your immune system is running smoothly, you don't notice that it's there. But if it stops working properly – because it's weak or can't fight particularly aggressive germs – you get ill. Germs that your body has never encountered before are also likely to make you ill. Some germs will only make you ill the first time you come into contact with them. These include childhood diseases like chickenpox . Without an immune system, we would have no way to fight harmful things that enter our body from the outside or harmful changes that occur inside our body. The main tasks of the body's immune system are to fight disease-causing germs (pathogens) like bacteria, viruses, parasites or fungi, and to remove them from the body. No one wants to buy homes there because they cannot make money out of them. This phenomenon, which is called rural depopulation, can lead to overcrowding in cities as well as to fewer people in country areas.

On example of this phenomenon is the Garrigus area of Spain, about one hour's drive from Barcelona. The area has a Mediterranean climate, but because it is high and not close to the sea, winter temperatures are quite low. The area is also the home of 220,000 people from about 180 different tribes who live deep in the forest. The rainforest itself is an important environment but, because of its size and location, it also plays a vital part in controlling the world's climate. It does this by taking in carbon dioxide and releasing oxygen.

Recently, however, large areas of the Amazon rainforest have been cut down to make more land for farmers. Farmers use most of the new land to grow soya beans, which they export to other parts of the world to be used as animal food. Increasingly, some soya beans are also being turned into food for human consumption.

Other areas of the rainforest are cleared by ranchers who use the land for their cattle, by loggers who sell the valuable tropical hardwood from the trees they cut down, or by oil companies who are trying to find more oil.

In addition to destroying ancient forests and changing the world's climate, deforestation is having a devastating effect on native population who are dependent on the rainforest for everything they need, from food and tools to medicines and shelter.

One of the most significant moments in IT history occurred at the close of the twentieth century when experts predicted that computer systems would **malfunction** at midnight on 31 December 1999. Computer scientists speculated that IT programmes would stop working or produce incorrect results because they stored years with two digits instead of four – 98 instead of 1998, for example. They believed that the year 2000 would be represented by 00, and would be interpreted by software as the year 1900. This became known as the Millennium Bug, or the Year 2000 Problem. They predicted that IT systems, ranging from meteorological devices and hospital equipment to data storage systems in governments, banks and airports, would fail. It was thought that embedded systems that also made use of date logic, such as utilities and other **crucial** infrastructure, would collapse too. When midnight arrived, the **Millennium Bug** caused only minimal damage; some Australian bus-ticket machines failed to work and a few British banking transactions were temporarily disrupted. Many still debate whether the Millennium bug's limited effect was thanks to substantial government expenditure or whether its predicted threat was overstated by the media.
