and seven toy astronauts sitting under a tree. How many toy astronauts does he see? The next day, Little sees them again.




"We have lost our spaceships!" they say.

Now will each soldier have a drum?


As the happy soldiers march away, they say, "Come to the toy parade today!" Count the soldiers.

Then they march right down the street. The toy parade begins at last.




Little waves as the soldiers march past.

How many balloons do they drop?




He does not fly. Pop, pop, pop, pop, pop go some balloons. How many balloons popped? nine 2000000 How many balloons are left?
