




It has five rooms. Count them.

Little plays with them. "I will catch you," he says.




"No!" say the rabbits. They hop down a rabbit hole. How many are left?





"I know how to get cool," he says. He hops five hops to the beach.






Just then some little crabs run by. How many?

He picks up the sea star and counts its arms.




"You have more arms than I do," he says.

The little sea star in his hand is sad.








