Course number: 543 PHCL
Semester: Tenth Semester (Fifth year).
Duration: 2 + 0 Units (2 contact hours) per week.

Expanding on knowledge of disease states and therapies reviewed in previous or concurrent courses, students will be challenged in “capstone” experiences to manage pharmaceutical care problems in ambulatory and acute care settings.
