<b>Course number:</b> 551 PHCL

<b>Aims:</b> To study the governmental law, regulations and ethics related to all aspects of the profession of pharmacy.	
<b>Objectives:</b> Upon successful completion of the course the student should be able to point out laws, ethics, regulations and their application in various solutions in pharmacy practice.	
<b>Contents:</b> Governmental laws, regulations, detailed laws that govern and affect the practice of pharmacy such as drugs, narcotics and medical devices. General legal principles, non-controlled prescription requirements and over the counter drug requirements with emphasis on the responsibilities of the pharmacist in the care of patients. It acquaints the student with professional ethics in order to help his/her future success in pharmacy practice.
