Do المشددة Emphatic Do

Do is usually used as an auxiliary in negative and question forms However, the auxiliary *do* can also be used before the infinitive in

l **do** enjoy his company.

He **does** like to talk.

We can also use emphatic do to show a contrast between exp

A: You didn't call me yesterday. B: I did call you yes We usually get along very well, but we do have argumeters or cas

Note: Emphatic do is strongly emphasized in speech.

He likes football.

I liked that game.

Expressing Enthusiasm with Intensifiers and Adjectives

We use the intensifiers *really, very, absolutely and quite* with adjectives to express our enthusiasm with something. There are two kinds of adjectives: gradable and non-gradable. Gradable adjectives can be measured in degrees, such as size, age, quality etc. Non-gradable adjectives cannot be measured like this.



Note: The intensifier *really* can be used with both gradable and non-gradable adjectives.
