Pasqua Rosee, who was from Smyrna, in Turkey opened the first coffee house in London in 1652. Coffee was an immediate success and large numbers of coffee houses opened. They became the centre of social life in London. The servants of important men went from one coffee house to another, and passed on the latest news stories about what politicians were doing or what was happening on the other side of the world.

These solar energy-trapping gases are called Greenhouse Gases. Water **vapour**, carbon dioxide and methane are some of the Greenhouse Gases. Human activities that increase the level of Greenhouse Gases in the atmosphere may be warming Earth's atmosphere. The burning of coal, oil and natural gases in power stations, and the burning of fuel in traditional **vehicles**, releases large amounts of Greenhouse Gases into the air. Deforestation means that trees that would normally **absorb** carbon dioxide cannot remove it from atmosphere. If the increased carbon dioxide means more heat is trapped, the result will be global warming: a gradual increase in the temperature of the atmosphere of Earth. The amount of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere has been steadily increasing. Between 1900 and 2000, global carbon dioxide emissions went from 2 billion to 24 billion tons. parks, they cannot be used for housing or agriculture.
