# WORDS and WORD FORMATION PROCESSES.

### 1–Etymology

The study of the **origin and history** of a word دراسة <mark>اصل</mark> المكلمة و تاريخها .

### <mark>2-Coinage</mark>

The least common processes of word-formation in English is "Coinage". That is the **invention** of totally new terms and using it for any version of that product.

اختراع كلمة جديدة تماما.

Ex. Kleenex, Teflon, Xerox.

# 3–Borrowing

That is **taking** over of words from other languages.

الاستعارة من لغات أخرى . Ex. Alcohol (Arabic) Croissant (French)

### 4-Compounding

The joining of two separate words to produce a single form . الدمج : الجمع بين كلمتين لتشكيل كلمه واحده جديده . Ex. Bookcase, fingerprint, sunburn.

### 5–<mark>Blending</mark>

Blending is typically accomplished by **taking** only **the beginning of** one word and joining it to the end of the other word. . المزج : جمع البداية من كلمه مع نهاية الكلمة الأخرى Ex. Gasoline + Alcohol = Gasohol Smoke + Fog = Smog

### 6-Clipping

When a word of more than one syllable is **reduced** to a **shorter form**, often in casual speech, is called clipping.

التقطيع: انقاص او قطع بعض المقاطع في الكلمة التي تحتوي على اكثر من مقطع لتصبح بصيغه المقطيع: المقاص او قطع بعض المقاطع في الكلمة التي تحتوي أعلى المقاص المقاطع في المقدم المقطيع.

يستخدم في كلام العامة. <mark>Ex. Gasoline = Gas</mark> Advertisement = Ad

# 7-Backformation

A word of one type of (usually a noun ) is **reduced** to **form** another word of a different type ( usually a verb ) . . إعادة التشكيل : انقاص كلمه بصيغه معينه الى كلمه بصيغه أخرى مختلفة . من اسم مثلا الى فعل Ex. Television = Televise Donation = Donate

### 7–Conversion

A change in the function of a word. This process can also be called as " category change " and " functional change " . Butter (n) =Have you buttered (v) the toast ? Paper (n) =He is papering (v) the bedroom walls. . التحويل : تغيير وظيفة الكلمة ؛ من اسم الى فعل • Conversion can involve verbs becoming nouns. . و من فعل الى اسم Ex. Guess (v) =A guess(n) Spy (v) = A spy(n)

# 8–<mark>Acronyms</mark>

Acronyms are **formed** from the **initial letters** of a set of other words. الاسم المختصر : اختصار يتكون من الاحرف الأولى من الكلام . example.

ATM(Automatic Teller Machine )

# 9-Derivation

The process of forming new words by adding affixes. . الاشتقاق : بإضافة الزوائد للكلمة اما في مقدمتها او نهايتها

البادئات و اللواحق : Prefixes and Suffixes

Some affixes have to be added to the **beginning** of a word. These are called **PREFIXES.** 

Some affixes have to be added to the <mark>end</mark> of the word. They are called <mark>SUFFIXES .</mark>

Ex. Mislead mis =prefix

اعداد : سارا . ترجمة : فاطمة..

<mark>Disrespectful</mark> dis =prefix

ful = suffix

Infixes : Infix is an affix which is incorporated inside another word.
Ex, Singabloodypore.
هذا النوع يكون مضاف في وسط الكلمه.

### **#EPONYMS**

words based on **a name of a person or a place.** . اشتقاق الکلمات من اسم شخص او مکان e.g. sandwich, jeans, watt.

### **#HYPOCORISMS**

A longer word is **reduced** to a single syllable, then "-y " or " -ie " is **added** to the end.

e.g. Moving pictures =Movie Television =Telly تقليص الكلمة الطويلة لمقطع واحد و إضافة Y او Ie
